**Original Objectives:** The 1st Collaborative Project between UP Alumni and current U.P. students in the university campus: **to work side by side in the field, to provide classroom lectures of their expertise, and to develop mentoring relationships.**

**Accomplishments:** *All objectives are accomplished. I personally delivered funds last September-October 2016 for the following recipients and projects and spent time with the student groups in the evaluations, revisions, and budget allocations of their proposals. Meals are provided in our meetings and gatherings for community building between the recipients, staff and myself. The Project's design provided a personally productive and fulfilling fieldwork outreach experience for the Team. It is a Project with a Heart.*

**Project Agapay:** *GAP made UP President Alfredo Pascual aware of our UPAAA, Inc. Project service to the University. He attended and participated as one of the five (5) alumni Mentors who shared their journey as students to their careers during our "Gabi ng Salo-Salo" for all U.P. Diliman recipients and staff. It was a big treat for the students to listen to him in an intimate setting.*

**Invitation from Ramon Maronilla, Esq, President, UPAA UP System to join their delegation to UP Mindanao led to the Awards in the University with expedited Search, Interviews, Proposal Guidance, and Evaluation from our Friday arrival to Sunday departure, in collaboration with UPAA Davao and UPAA Mindanao members.**

**U.P. Diliman Awardees:** *\$3,000 for UP Student Catholic Action/UPSCA Five (5) Diversified Projects: Academic Assistance to the Sampaguita Kids: "At a very young age, these children are already exposed to the harsh social reality and are forced to financially support their families. Despite all odds, the perseverance of these street children to pursue their studies is truly admirable. To somehow aid in their studies, this project aims to provide academic assistance to the street children who sell sampaguita around the premises of the Parish of the Holy Sacrifice."*

**Barriowork Program:** *"A form of social immersion that provides avenue for UPSCAn's experience to see reality in the eyes of those in the peripheries. It is part of the SEE-JUDGE-ACT paradigm that enables us to experience first-handedly the living conditions of the marginalized. The Barriowork lasts for one whole week."*

**Service Programs and Institutional Visits:** *Labor Union, TAHANAN, PAPURI: "Immersion of participants with the constituents of groups or institutions identified as one of the least, last, and lost. It helps the organization to see the local realities in the eyes of those in the peripheries."*

**Leadership and Self-Awareness Camp:** *"offers a "break" for the UPSCAn's, which consists of talks, personal reflection and contemplation, that aim to provide the leaders and members with the opportunity to gain a better sense of self, which in turn, will lead to better thinking and rational decision-making skills."*

**NGO and Public Service Organization Job and Volunteer Fair:** *"a two-day job fair where representatives from various public service and non-profit sectors will be invited to discuss the career and volunteering opportunities available in their organizations to UP students, alumni and non-UP students."*

**\$1,800 Molave Residence Hall Association: Multi-Purpose Hall Renovation:** *"Due to its old age, the MPH has become dilapidated. It is currently used as a storage room for the dormitory's old and damaged facilities, and the bicycles of the residents. Through this project, we are hoping to bring back its original functional state as a Study Hall, for Group Discussions with other residents, and Non-Academic Activities."*

**\$2,000 U.P. Concert Chorus: Rehearsal Hall Steel-Framed Full Body Mirror:** To aid UPCC, one of the official performing groups of UP Diliman, in their intensive preparations for choral performances especially for their choreography rehearsals. To conduct workshops with the help of mirror for different choral groups in campus.

**\$2,000 Project Tahanan “BalikUPDorm” for Acacia Residence Hall:** To restore, renovate or build common dorm areas where students can interact with dormmates, entertain guests, dine, study or simply chill to balance off their demanding academic requirements.

**\$1,266 HINABI Project: Integrated Marketing Communication (IMC) Summit 2016** This is “an academic requirement for our Business and Corporate Communication Class (SPCM 111), aims to collaborate with small and medium enterprises and UP Alumni in organizing a learning event on Integrated Marketing Communications (IMC) to senior high school students. **This two-day event has the following major activities: seminar-workshop on IMC, an IMC campaign competition, and a Trade Expo featuring the products of local SMEs.**”

**\$1,025 5<sup>th</sup> Region-Wide Inter- High School Speak-Up! Competition Organized by the Communicators’ Guild of the BA Communication Arts Program of UP Mindanao.** Ten (10) High schools joined the Oratorical & Extemporaneous Speaking Contest and six (6) schools for the radio Broadcasting Scriptwriting Contest participated. The Communicators’ Guild invited six (6) UP BA Communication Arts Alumni, who are experts in the fields as judges.

**\$366 PAMAMAHAYAG: A Seminar-Workshop on Campus Journalism.** Organized by the Communication Guild, the course-based organization of the BA Communication Arts program of the College of Humanities and Social Sciences in the University of the Philippines Mindanao. “They coordinated with the principal of Marahan National High School (Marahan NHS) to conduct the campus journalism seminar-workshop. 40 students (from Grade 7 – Grade 12) of both Marahan NHS and MarilogNHS joined the event. They tapped two UP BA Communication Arts Alumni, who are experts in campus journalism, to be the resource speakers and trainers for the seminar-workshop. The students who actively participated on the seminar-workshop are currently members of their respective school publications.”
